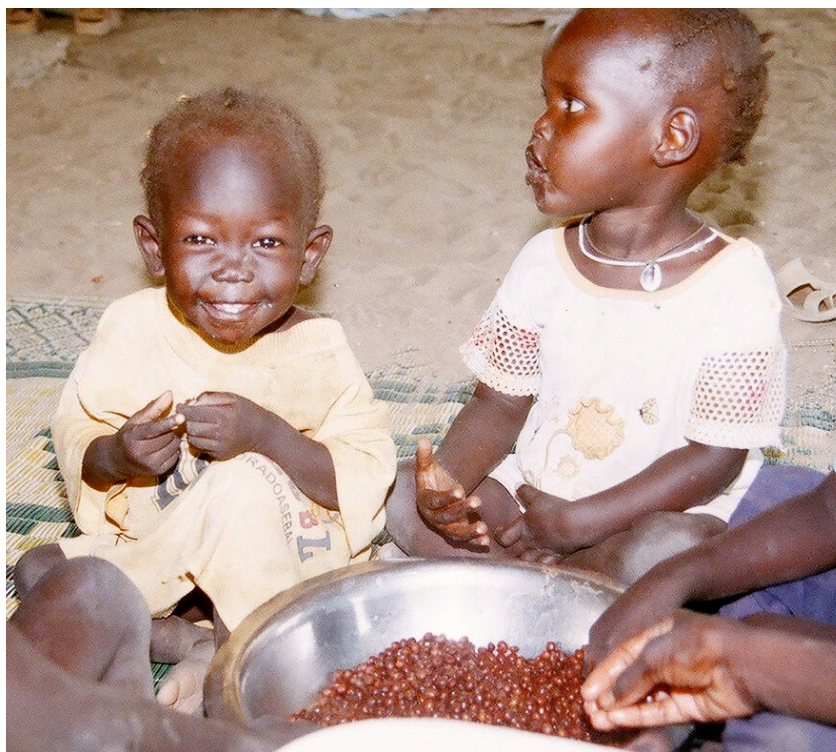

Dear Friends,

You will find enclosed two cardboard boxes which are very easily convertible into a **MONEYBOX OF THE SUDANESE CHILD.**

ASASE has adapted to Switzerland this operation launched in France by Operation Orange, a sister association which has been helping us for years to collect funds for our action in Sudan.

What we suggest is quite simple: **starting this Christmas a series of small generous deeds that have substantial and tangible consequences.** Imagine: **each time a 2 CHF coin is dropped into the moneybox, the daily meal of a Sudanese child is ensured during 10 days !**



A child living in the most total destitution of the camps for displaced people that are located in the deserts surrounding Khartoum; one of the 10 000 children aged from 3 to 10 who are beneficiaries from our feeding program created in 2002 in 18 centres within the camps.

Yes, as you may have understood it, dear Friends, this long-term publicity campaign is not specifically meant for you who have faithfully supported us, sometimes for more than twenty years...

Our primary target is the heart of the children and of the young people around you.

Put somewhere in their home, the MONEYBOX OF THE SUDANESE CHILD will help them open their heart to the unfortunate lot of their distant brothers, and will appeal to their solidarity and their generosity all through 2007!

“For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also” (Matthew, 6,21)

Dropping a coin into the moneybox will be a plain life-giving act for the children, a small gesture that will help us fight the diseases and the effects of malnutrition (psychic disorders, immunizing deficiencies, motory and intellectual troubles, deterioration of reproductive functions, blindness, death).

At the end of 2007, we will send you some “Moneybox of the Sudanese child” postal checks, to collect the donations dropped into the moneyboxes.

Now that Christmas is there, why not put a moneybox at the bottom of the tree or in front of the crib?

And what about offering a box to another family?

Do not hesitate to ask us for additional moneyboxes if need be.

In any case, we thank you in advance for your contribution, and we are counting on you to convey this publicity campaign to those who have not been touched yet by the spirit of our guide, Sister Emmanuelle.

Let her enthusiasm for this project (see the picture on the moneybox) hearten all our Friends in Switzerland!!!
